What Our Godparents Promised at Our Baptism

On this Baptism of our Lord weekend, let's briefly look at how our Baptism should be lived out during our life. During our Baptism, our godparents promised, on our behalf, that we would follow the Precepts of the Church:

1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.

2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year to a priest.

3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.

4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.

5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church.

Jesus said in John 14:15, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." How are you doing? If you are in a ministry role—lector, sacristan, extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, music volunteer—how are you doing?

All of us need to become H.O.L.Y: <u>humble</u>, <u>obedient</u>, <u>love</u> God and neighbor, and <u>yearn</u> for the salvation of souls.

How are you doing? Are you and I setting the example for future generations? If our faith is average, the next generation will be below average. Remember that the latest statistic is that only 7 of 100 kids baptized today will be at church when they are 35. We must live out heroic virtue. If one member of the Body suffers, the whole body suffers.

More and more people are talking to me about the pot epidemic. We are seeing young people whose brains are being "fried." Contractors and business owners are telling me that it is getting harder to find workers in Grand and Jackson Counties. The reports are increasing: More and more of the young people are lacking in a serious work ethic or they just quit. [If everyone would surrender his/her life to the Lord Jesus and work with Him, this epidemic could be reversed!]

Second Collections

As usual, we begin our second collections for January and February. These collections stay with the particular church in which they are collected. This money is used to repair buildings and pay for needed improvements.

For example, last year at St. Bernard we spent about \$8,000 for the new carpet and installation, and about \$33,000 for installation of a new underground (9 feet

under!) water pipe system. (Obviously the old system was leaking badly.) Our yearly second collection at St. Bernard was about \$27,500 for Jan-Feb and Jul-Aug. So we spent more money than we took in from second collections. We need to save for a "rainy day."

At Our Lady of the Snow, we plan on replacing the carpet (over \$12,000) and more importantly, we need a sump pump system to push water away from the building. The basement has continual water damage. We all know that the sump system (lots of digging and a long pipe system) will cost a pretty penny!

This Is What Is Brewing in Colorado

The state wants to force a false human sexuality curriculum down our throats. The following was taken directly from https://leg.colorado.gov/bills/hb19-1032

HB19-1032

Comprehensive Human Sexuality Education

Concerning comprehensive human sexuality education, and, in connection therewith, making an appropriation. **SESSION: 2019 Regular Session**

SUBJECT: Education & School Finance (Pre & K-12) **BILL SUMMARY**

The bill moves provisions of the statutory legislative declaration to a nonstatutory legislative declaration. The bill clarifies content requirements for public schools that offer comprehensive human sexuality education and prohibits instruction from explicitly or implicitly teaching or endorsing religious ideology or sectarian tenets or doctrines, using shame-based or stigmatizing language or instructional tools, employing gender norms or gender stereotypes, or excluding the relational or sexual experiences of lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender individuals.

Current law provides for a comprehensive human sexuality education grant program. The bill amends certain provisions of the grant program to: -Require the department of public health and environment to submit an annual report concerning the outcomes of the grant program indefinitely; -Add 8 representatives to the oversight entity and require membership of the oversight entity to be comprised of at least 7 members who are members of groups of people who have been or might be discriminated against;

-Require grant applicants to demonstrate a need for money to implement comprehensive human sexuality education; and

-Require that rural public schools or public schools that do not currently offer comprehensive human sexuality education receive priority when selecting grant applicants.

The bill provides a general appropriation of at least \$1 million annually for the grant program.

The bill prohibits the state board of education from waiving the content requirements for any public school that provides comprehensive human sexuality education.

A courageous married couple from our parish sent the following letter to State Representative Becker:

"I am shocked that HB-1032 has even been allowed to move forward. Teaching children that homosexuality is normal is wrong enough, but disallowing different points of view to be presented is even worse. You hide

behind mantras like "separation of church and state" vet are happy to press your own dogmas onto others. Please kill this legislation."

So we all can find any bill on leg.colorado.gov and write to our representatives expressing our Christian sentiments. I pray with all kinds of people who do not know their identity and have experimented sexually. They contact me freely. Many have a deep sense of regret for their behaviors (just as we have a deep regret for our sins) and many are upset with how their parents raised them (lacking a sense of direction/purpose and a relationship with God), and/or the abuse that occurred. The abuse causes deep psychological pain and they experiment with behaviors to "fix" the pain. But, if they form a friendship with God and receive His sacraments, they begin to experience peace. The wounded want us to tell the truth and be their family!

Wisdom of The Dialogue of St. Catherine

We introduced in the December 9 bulletin that we would place summaries of *The Dialogue* in the bulletin. Here is a summary of the <u>first chapter</u> of the book.

St. Catherine's initial remarks state: "A soul rises up, restless with tremendous desire for God's honor and the salvation of souls. She has for some time exercised herself in virtue and has become accustomed to dwelling in the cell of self-knowledge in order to know better God's goodness toward her, since upon knowledge follows love. And loving, she seeks to pursue truth and clothe herself in it."

Later she says, "Now this soul's will was to know and follow truth more courageously."

Eventually she makes four petitions: (1) for herself, (2) reform of Holy Church [which had problems with unorthodoxy and corruption back in the 1300s, also] (3) peace of heart for Catholics who are rebelling against Church teaching with great disrespect and persecution, and (4) a special intention.
