Wisdom of The Dialogue of St. Catherine

Summary of Chapter 30. God the Father says to St. Catherine: "Open your mind's eye and look at those who drown by their own choice, and see how low they have fallen by their sins." They are dead because of selfish sensuality and see nothing but themselves. They remember nothing of God's mercy.

"Because these three powers (memory, understanding, and will) are dead, everything they do in intention or in fact is dead so far as grace is concerned." "They become unbearable to themselves." They are ruled by sin.

Their four chief vices are pride, sensual selfishness (using the five senses for selfish, unholy reasons), impatience, and lack of discernment.

"So their wretched little souls are filled with thanklessness, the source of all evils. Had they been grateful for the blessings they received from Me, they would know Me."

Reminder Regarding the Precious Blood

Every once in awhile, someone asks me why our churches do not serve the Precious Blood from the chalice. The quick answer is that we do not need to. **When we receive the Host, we receive the entire Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ.** We get the Blood!

Did you know that, basically, only the U.S. and Canada serve Jesus from the chalice? Even the Vatican does not serve the Precious Blood (Jesus) from the chalice.

Recently two Denver Catholic Churches stopped serving from the chalice for multiple reasons; here are a few: (1) Profanation—the Blood was being spilled onto the floor (and it takes special attention and time to clean properly), (2) the deacons who cleansed the vessels were getting sick "a lot," and (3) the Mass was going longer due to the serving from the chalice and cleansing the vessels.
