a row. You pick the starting date. I hope you begin as
soon as you see this bulletin.

You can pray it for three intentions:

(1) For the full restoration of the Catholic Church on
earth and unity in the Truth.

(2) For the Pan-Amazon Synod (a conference that
begins on Sunday, October 6 in Rome concerning the
Amazon region) to follow God's plan.

(3) To prepare your hearts for All Saints Day on
November 1, a holy day of obligation.

Jesus Even Told St. Faustina to Ask the Saints for Help in the Diary

(**Paragraph 1560**). February 3, (1938). Today after
Holy Communion, Jesus again gave me a few
directives: **First, do not fight against temptation by
yourself, but disclose it to the confessor at once,
and then the temptation will lose all its force.
Second, during these ordeals do not lose your
peace; live in My presence; ask My Mother and the
Saints for help. Third, have the certitude that I am
looking at you and supporting you. Fourth, do not
fear either struggles of the soul or any temptations,
because I am supporting you; if only you are
willing to fight, know that the victory is always on
your side. Fifth, know that by fighting bravely you
give Me great glory and amass merits for yourself.
Temptation gives you a chance to show Me your
fidelity.**

(59) On one occasion I heard these words in my
soul, **Make a novena for your country. This novena
will consist of the recitation of the Litany of the
Saints.**

It is more powerful to approach God with the angels
and saints than to go by ourselves! They want to pray

Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion--EMHC

Reminder: priests and deacons are ordinary ministers. EMHCs are only to be used when the priest thinks there is an extraordinary need. Guideline: If there are less than 150 people at Mass, there is no need of an EMHC. Even if you are scheduled, the priest may not need you for a Mass. Also, the clergy will probably visit the sick.

Political versus Moral Issues

Abortion is a moral issue. "Thou shalt not kill." Homosexual activity is a moral issue. The Bible tells us to avoid this behavior. Voting for a pro-death politician is a moral issue. One is complicit in bringing about a pro-death culture if he or she votes for a pro-death person. We will have to answer for everything that we think, say and do on Judgment Day. All of us Catholics need to remind ourselves of this. We have a duty to do good, expose evil, and avoid evil. The clergy and the people have a duty to talk about the issues! To not talk about the issues would be to be an unfaithful servant.

Wisdom of The Dialogue of St. Catherine

Summary of Chapter 32. In chapter 31, the God the Father spoke of four chief vices, especially selfish sensuality. There are many sins. He says that lust is really bad. He says that we were created to be like

angels and when we fall into lust, we become like pigs rolling in the mud. Even demons "cannot stand the sight" of this sin. Even philosophers of old who did not have the light of grace knew, by natural light, that lust beclouds the mind.

Summary of Chapter 33. Another evil sin is avarice, or greed. It scorns God's generosity. Many murders, thefts, pillages, and unlawful profits are the result of this sin. This sin scorns God's generosity and blots out His mercy from their memories. The Father asks, "But if they will not share their possessions, how will they ever give their lives for the salvation of souls? How will they give affection if they are being eaten up by envy?"
