The Nativity Scene and Simplicity and Humility

In 1223 for Christmas, in order to try to experience Christ's birth on a deeper level, St. Francis of Assisi had a nativity scene created in a cave in the town of Greccio. He had a real ox and ass placed in a living crèche. Francis said, "I wish to evoke remembrance of the child quite realistically, how he was born in Bethlehem, and of all the hardship he must have endured in his childhood. I would like to see with my bodily eyes how it was, to lie in a manger and to sleep on hay between and ox and ass."

Where did St Francis get the idea of the ox and the ass? From the prophet Isaiah. Isaiah 1:3 states: "The ox knows its owner, and the ass its master's crib; but Israel does not know, my people does not understand." All of us—humans and animals—lacked understanding and reason, after the fall of Adam and Eve. However, the Christ-child in the crib opened the eyes of understanding to all. The animals recognize God. They follow their nature. Now we must follow our true nature. What is our true nature? St. John Vianney gives us a simple answer. He said, "The other day—the little birds were singing in the woods. I began to weep. Poor little creatures, I thought within myself, the good God has made you to sing, and you sing. Yet man, who was created that he might love God, loves Him not!" Our true nature is to love God. How do we do this? We pray daily, throughout the day. We study and follow His commandments. We get to Mass every week and worship as a community. We repent of our sins in the confessional. We help and love our neighbor. We take care of the poor.

The animals recognized Christ. Do you recognize Christ? Or are you like Herod, who wanted to have great power in this world? Do we rationalize our faith, saying, "I have my own spirituality and I don't need the Catholic Church"? There are people who think they are too sophisticated for the simplicity of Christ and the Church He founded.

Who does recognize Jesus and God's plan? The simple and the humble: people like Joseph, Mary, the Magi, and the shepherds. Do we recognize Him? Are we simple and humble?
