Quick Apologetics (Defending Your Faith)—Salvation

After all, John 10:28 says: "No one can take my sheep out of my hand." We need to know the whole Bible before giving answers too quickly. Let's think about this. Second, we know that faith is a free gift from God, and we can lose it if we are not careful. Paul states in 1 Timothy 1:18-19: "This charge I commit to you, Timothy, my son, in accordance with the prophetic utterances which pointed to you, that inspired by them you may wage the good warfare, holding faith and a good conscience. By rejecting conscience, certain persons have made shipwreck of their faith."

Our Church (headed by Jesus) teaches that our eternal destiny depends on the state of our soul at the time of our death. Did we love God and our neighbor? Was Jesus our best friend? The bottom line is that we need to persevere in our faith every day; we are not saved once and then we get slothful about our faith. We work with the Lord every day, relying on His graces.
