<u>Celebrate the 100-year Anniversary of the Fatima</u> <u>Apparitions of Mary to the Three Children (Lucia,</u> Francisco, and Jacinta)

There is a Rosary procession at Our Lady of Fatima Church in Lakewood this coming Saturday, May 13, at 4 p.m. followed by a 5 p.m. Mass and potluck dinner. To receive a plenary indulgence on this day, you must go to Confession and Communion, be interiorly detached from sin, and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father on that day.

Yesterday, May 6, we celebrated a First Saturday devotion at Our Lady. Thanks to those who came.

The First Five Saturdays Devotion

On the first Saturday during 5 consecutive months, the devotion consists of (in reparation for the sins committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary):

- 1. Going to Confession,
- 2. Receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion,
- 3. Saying five decades of the Rosary,
- **4.** Meditating for 15 minutes on the mysteries of the Rosary.

Why Five Saturdays?

Sister Lucia's confessor questioned her about the reason for the five Saturdays asking why not seven or nine. She answered him in a letter dated June 12, 1930. In it she related about a vision she had of Our Lord while staying in the convent chapel part of the night in May, 1930. The reasons Our Lord gave were as follows: The five first Saturdays correspond to the five kinds of offenses and blasphemies committed against the Immaculate Heart of Mary. They are:

- a. Blasphemies against the Immaculate Conception
- b. Blasphemies against her virginity
- c. Blasphemies against her divine maternity, at the same time the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all men
- d. Instilling indifference, scorn and even hatred towards this Immaculate Mother in the hearts of children
- e. Direct insults against Her sacred images

Let us keep the above reasons firmly in our minds. Devotions have intentions attached to them, and knowing them adds merit and weight to their practice.

This Devotion is So Necessary in Our Days

The culture of vice and sin is rampant. Abortion, blasphemy, drug abuse, pornography, divorce and bad marriages, religious indifference, the advances of the homosexual agenda and others are just some of society's many plagues that cut deeply into the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

We must console Our Lady amidst all these insults and injuries to her and her Divine Son. She asks for reparation, she pleads for our prayers, she hopes for our amendment of life. Let us listen to her maternal pleas and atone for the ingratitude of mankind. And let us help those who are hurting from falling into grave sin.

The Father chose you before time to bear His Son, and He prepared you, by the power of the Holy Spirit and through a unique gift of grace, to be the worthy Mother of our salvation. Today we entrust to you this Church, (St. Anne in Grand Lake or

St. Bernard of Montjouz in Fraser or Our Lady of the Snow in Granby or St. Peter or St. Ignatius). We ask you to bless, in the name of your divine Son, every family, every home and every place of work within it.

Through your prayers, may we work for the proclamation of the Gospel, seeking always to laud and magnify God's holy name in every pastoral work in which we engage. We place under your patronage and we entrust to you every society and organization of this church. Inspire within us a deeper faith, an ardent hope, and a more selfless love so that we may serve the Church your Son has founded and work with Him for the salvation of all.
