Mission Talk. The Angels: Messengers of a Loving God. Monday, Feb. 11; 6:30 – 8 p.m.; OLS

Our speaker, Fr. Piotr Prusakiewicz, CSMA, is chief editor of two magazines, *The Angels: Messengers from a Loving God*, a quarterly magazine in English on the subject of Angels, Archangels, Knighthood of St. Michael the Archangel and Divine Mercy; and (2) *Who is Like God*, a bi-monthly magazine on Holy Angels printed in the Polish language dedicated solely to the subject of angels.

Jesus: "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Praying with the Bible: A Brief Introduction to Ignatian Biblical Meditation:

- **1.** *Begin:* Consider how God looks upon you and loves you; become aware of being in God's presence. Stand for a moment, bow if you wish, then be seated for prayer.
- **2.** *Preparatory Prayer:* Offer to God all your will and actions, especially in this time of prayer. Ask God for a specific grace that you need and desire right now (peace, consolation, hope, etc.).
- **3.** *Meditate on the Biblical Text* that you have selected:
- -*Read* the biblical text through slowly, recalling what it is about; then let it come alive for you!
- -Reflect on the truths God wants to teach you in this text.
- -Ponder the meaning of each word, phrase, and sentence.
- -Focus on two or three points (words, phrases, images, ideas) that stand out to you.
- **-Embrace** what God is saying to you; let your heart be moved with love and desire.
- *-Notice* what is going on <u>inside you</u> as you pray: joy, sorrow, peace, confusion, love, anger, etc.
- -If you get distracted or your mind wanders, gently return to the biblical text and your focal points.
- **4.** *Colloquy:* Enter into a short personal conversation with Jesus (or God the Father, or the Holy Spirit). Speak heart-to-heart, as if conversing with a close friend.
- **5.** *Closing Prayer:* Conclude by praying the Our Father, Hail Mary, or another familiar/favorite prayer. You might stand, kneel, bow, raise your hands, or adopt another posture to mark the end of your prayer.

Summary of chapter 5. God the Father: "The willing desire to suffer every pain and hardship even to the point of death for the salvation of souls is very pleasing to Me. The more you bear, the more you show your love for Me." "When love grows, so does sorrow."

"The soul, therefore, who chooses to love Me must also choose to suffer for Me anything at all that I give her. Patience is not proved except in suffering, and patience is one with charity...Endure courageously."
