It will take more time to determine the impacts of the recent elections. We do know that we have more work to do regarding the sanctity of human life. Colorado voters rejected a simple proposition that would reduce abortions in the last few weeks of pregnancy - the time that many premature babies are able to survive outside of the womb. Perhaps we could have done better in explaining what the proposition was and the situations that it would apply to. However, I believe that there is a more important conclusion.

Many people in Colorado and in our community do not know Jesus Christ. They do not fully recognize the love that created them, keeps them in existence, and desires their happiness. They do not know the magnitude of God's grace and so do not know the proper response of love for God and neighbor that they should have. This is not a condemnation of them, for I believe that many if not most never have had the truth of God's existence and love presented to them in a winsome or persuasive way. If that is the case, then much of the fault falls on Christians like ourselves. In the coming weeks and months I ask you to join me in reevaluating our role in sharing the Gospel with those who need to hear it.
